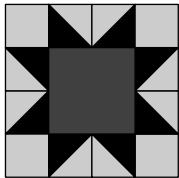


AUTUMN SPLENDOR

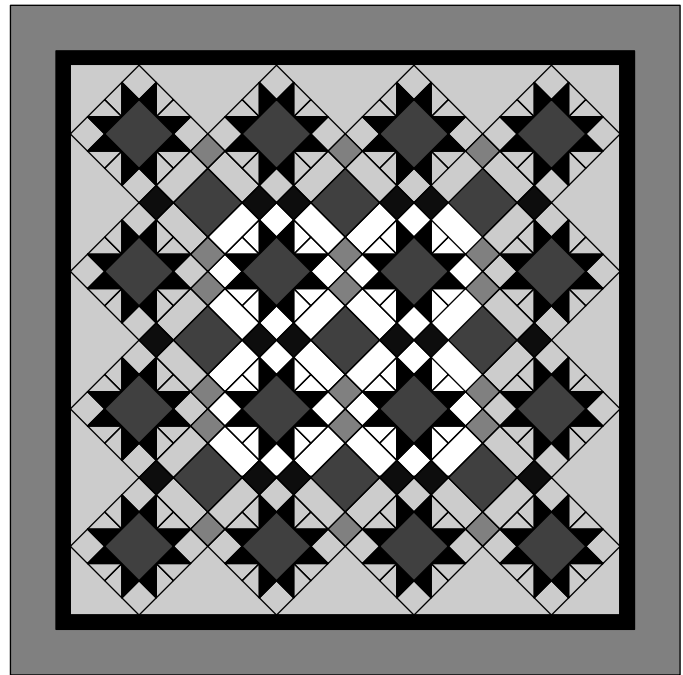
Requirements:


Light background	1/2 yard
Medium background	1 1/2 yard
Star Points	1/2 yard
Star Centers & Border	1 1/2 yard
Square Centers	1/4 yard
Square Corners & Border	1/8 yard each of 4 colors


2" Half Square Triangle Paper – 4 sheets, plus 1 strip

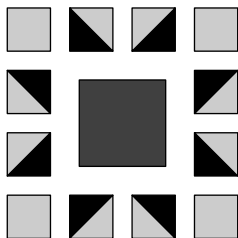


The Star block turned on point creates the Ohio Star illusion.

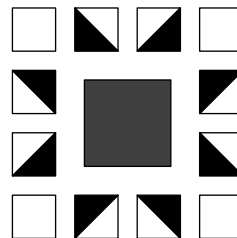


 = 8/block – 12 blocks = 96 half squares. Cut fabric slightly larger than the paper grid. Place light fabrics right sides together, with paper on top of the background fabric. Stitch on the dotted lines. Cut on all the solid lines, tear paper away, press seams toward darker fabric.

 = 8/block – 14 blocks = 32 half squares. Cut fabric slightly larger than the paper grid. Place light fabrics right sides together, with paper on top of the background fabric. Stitch on the dotted lines. Cut on all the solid lines, tear paper away, press seams toward darker fabric.




Piece star blocks as shown to the left.
Make 12 blocks.





Piece star blocks as shown to the left.
Make 4 blocks.

 Cut 2 1/2" x 2 1/2".

Cut 9 each of 4 colors = 36 total.
I used solids that were equal in value, but different colors.

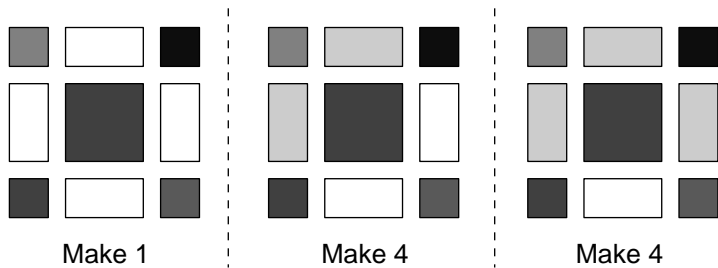
 Cut 9 -4 1/2" x 4 1/2" square centers.

 Cut 16 -2 1/2" x 4 1/2" from light background.

 Cut 20 -2 1/2" x 4 1/2" from medium background.

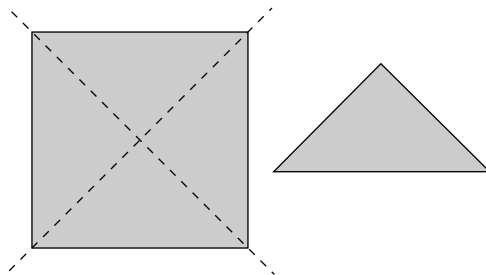
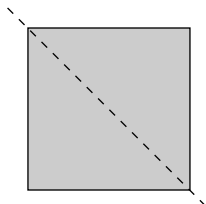

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Piece a total of 9 blocks as shown to the left. Below each block is the number of each needed.

Side Triangles – cut 3 -14½" squares, then cut diagonally into 4.



Corner Triangles – cut 2 -12½" square, then cut diagonally in half.

Finishing:

Piece blocks on point into a diagonal set as shown to the left. The side triangles are treated as a block in the row. Add the corner triangles last. The side triangles are larger than you will need. After you have pieced the top you can resize the top. I like to have some extra float room on the sides when I piece a diagonal set.

After the top is pieced, measure across the middle both vertically and horizontally. This will give you an average measurement to cut the border strips. You will have to piece the border strips to get the length you need.

The first border is cut 1½" x length of top. Add to the sides first, then the top and bottom.

The second border is cut 6½" x the length of the top (remember you have first borders added). Add to the first, then the top and bottom.

Layer, quilt, bind, sign and date your quilt.
