

Pinwheels On Parade

Designed by Mimi Shimp for use with Triangle Paper for Quilters™. This pattern is provided free for personal use. It may not be used for resale or any other commercial purpose.

Fabric Requirements:

White	2 yards
Prints	2 yards total
Black	1 yard (includes binding)

Triangle Paper™: 3 sheets 3" Quarter Square

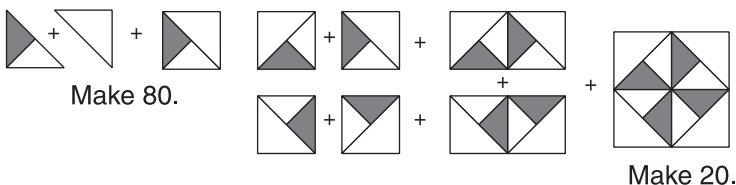
In this quilt I used 1930's reproduction fabrics. Just stitched up a bunch of triangles, and cut strips from as many fabrics as I had on hand at the time. This quilt looks great even if you don't want to go scrappy.

Cutting

1. Cut the quarter square paper into vertical strips, if you are making a scrappy quilt, otherwise you will use whole sheets. Layer white fabric and print fabric right sides together, with paper against the white fabric. Stitch on all the dashed lines, cut on all the solid lines, tear paper away, and press to the darker fabric.
2. From black, cut 2 strips 2½" x the width of the fabric. Cross-cut into 30 -2½" squares.
3. From prints, cut 7 strips 2½" x width of fabric (if you are using only 1 fabric). Cross-cut into 49 -6½" rectangles. If you are making a scrappy quilt, cut 49 -6½" rectangles from the prints you are using.
4. From white, cut 4 -3⅞" strips, then cross-cut into 20 -3⅞" squares. Cut these squares in half diagonally to make 40 triangles.

Piecing the quilt Top

1. Piece the quarter square units together with the white triangles cut in step 4 above. Make 80 squares. Trim dog ears. Piece these squares into pinwheel blocks. Make 20 blocks.

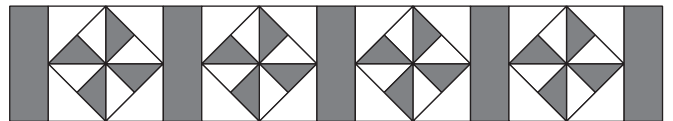


If you are making a scrappy quilt, make sure that each block has the same fabric triangle-squares.

2. Piece together 6 rows of black squares and lattice strips.



3. Piece together 5 rows of blocks and lattice strips.



4. Piece the quilt top together. No borders on this one! Just layer, quilt, and bind.
