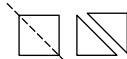


Cutting and Piecing

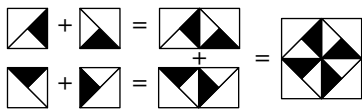
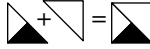
Step 1: Using 3 vertical strips cut from 2" quarter square paper layer fabric 1 and fabric 3 right sides together with paper on top of fabric 3. Stitch on all the dotted lines, cut apart on all the solid lines. Tear paper away, press seams toward darker fabric and trim "dog-ears". You will use 16.



Cut 8 -2 7/8" squares from fabric 1. Cut these in half diagonally to get 16 triangles.



Piece these units together to make 16 blocks as shown at the right. Then continue piecing these blocks together to make 4 pinwheels for the border (A).



NOTE:-Be careful to watch the orientation of the squares so you form correct pinwheels!

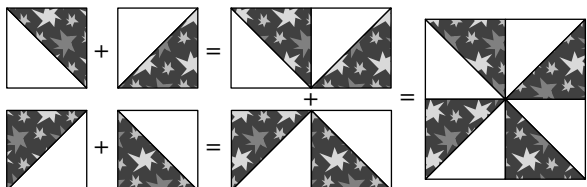
Step 2: Using 4 sheets plus 1 horizontal strip (cut from) 4" half square paper layer fabric 1 and fabric 2 right sides together with paper on top of fabric 2. Stitch on all the dotted lines, cut apart on all the solid lines. Tear paper away, press seams toward darker fabric and trim "dog-ears". Make 52.



Step 3: Using 3 sheets of 4" quarter square paper layer fabric 1 and fabric 3 right sides together with paper on top of fabric 3. Stitch on all the dotted lines, cut apart on all the solid lines. Tear paper, press and trim "dog-ears". You will use 48.



Using 3 sheets of 4" quarter square paper layer fabric 1 and fabric 2 right sides together with paper on top of fabric 2. Stitch on all the dotted lines, cut apart on all the solid lines. Tear paper, press and trim "dog-ears". You will use 52.

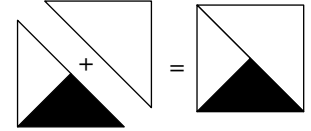

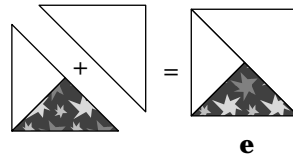
Step 4: Piece 'B' units. Piece the 52 half square triangles together to make 13 pinwheels (B).

Step 5: Piece quarter triangles into squares.

Piece 'e' units. Cut 10 -4 7/8" squares from fabric 1. Cut these in half diagonally to get 16 triangles. (Refer to step 1.)

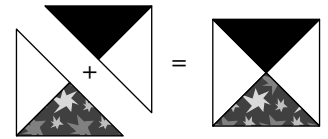


Piece together 8 units as shown at the right.

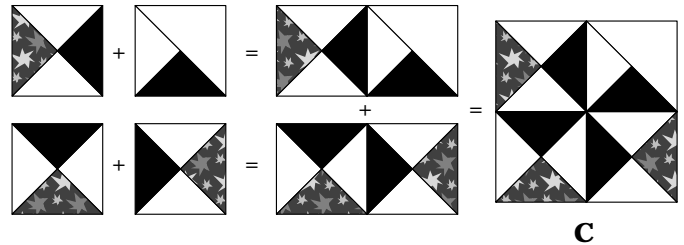


Piece together 12 units (e) as shown at the left. Set aside for the border.

Piece together 40 units as shown at the right.

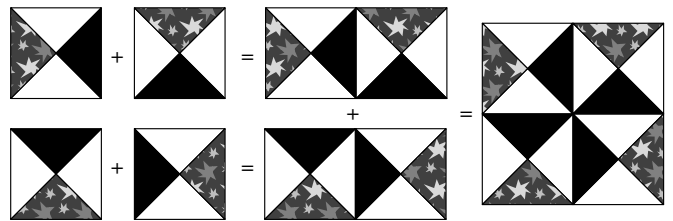


Step 6: Piece 'C' units. Using triangle squares made in step 5, piece units together as shown below to form Unit 'C'. NOTE: Be careful to watch the orientation of the squares so you form correct pinwheels! Make 8.

Step 7: Piece 'D' units. Using triangle squares made in step 5, piece D units together as shown below to form

Unit 'D'. NOTE: Be careful to watch the orientation of the squares so you form correct pinwheels! Make 4.

Step 8: Cut 8 -4 1/2" x 12 1/2" rectangles (f) and 4 -4 1/2" squares (g) for remaining border pieces.

Step 9: Piece **1** each of the border strips **X** and **Y** following the lettered sequence below. The orientation of the letter indicates positioning (upside down, etc.) Refer to photo.

Piece **2** border strips (**Z**) together following the lettered sequence below.

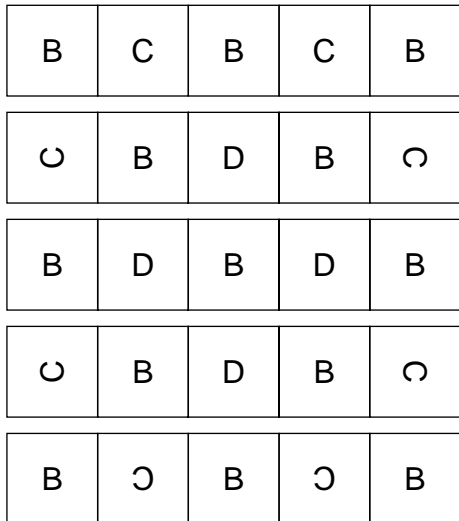

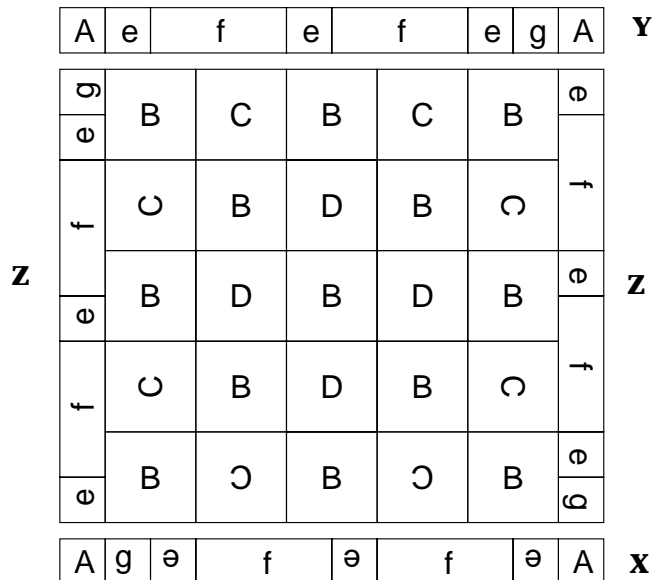

Lay all the blocks out first being careful to follow the positioning as shown below. The orientation of the letter indicates positioning of the block (upside down, sideways, etc.) Piece the blocks together into rows, then sew the rows together. Refer to photo.



Add the side border strips to the quilt top first, then add the top and bottom borders. Note orientation in photo.



Step 7: Press the top carefully before layering. After your top is basted together quilt it by hand or machine, then bind.

Don't forget to sign and date your quilt.

Fabric 3	Red	½ yard
Binding		½ yard

4" Half Square	5 sheets
4" Quarter Square	6 sheets
2" Quarter Square	1 sheet
